Mech Tech Dragons Get Their Assignment, "Recycling Rush"

Early in the morning of January 3, the MLWG's Mech Tech Dragons were given their assignment as part of the First Robotics Challenge. After months of anticipation and speculation regarding what the challenge would be, the team was confronted with the 2015 challenge..."Recycling Rush."

The challenge for the 2015 game will be to design a remotely controlled robot that can manipulate three objects: a plastic garbage can, a hard-sided crate, and - what many players expect to be the spoiler of this year's game - a swimming pool noodle. Extra points can be scored if the robot can place the noodle into the slotted lid of the garbage can - a little like inserting a straw into the top of a to-go cup. Points are deducted for litter left on the playing field at the end of play. Teams will also be able to partner to work their side of a field of "litter" as they race to get as much as possible stacked up in the time allowed.

Over the next few days, the various responsibilities for the competition were divided into three subsystem categories, with team leaders appointed for each group. These groups include: Drivetrain (headed by **Ryan Masak**), Stacking Mechanism (headed by **Nyle Rodgers**), and Auto Can Grabber (headed by **Stephen Holtz**).

Now begins the hard work, as the team must complete all of their robot building by the end of the day on February 17.
