<ul> <li>Todd Raviotta has completed the updates to the marketing video. He is adding some additional active shots of MLWGS students and will send it for another review. Subtitles will be required to be viewed on the school website. Leslie Hausser has asked the technology committee to take this task on for finalization of the video.</li> <li>Other ideas for the committee to consider: how do we communicate with colleges? Are we marketing with the idea of the types of colleges our students attend? Should we reach out to elementary schools?</li> <li>Barbara Marshall indicated that MLWGS website needs some updates to maintain compliance with any potential civil rights violations. She has taken down videos, links and, documents to review compliance and identify if all is meets the requirements recommended for the visually impaired. This includes subtitles. Barbara will also communicate this to Todd Raviotta re: the video.</li> <li>Planning</li> <li>Raye Rector reported that the admissions testing was completed last Saturday. It needed to be updated primarily to avoid having students prep in advance.</li> <li>Demographics are not identified in the selection process. The info is collected after students are selected and various school divisions look at this.</li> <li>The planning committee does not determine who is selected for admission. It was reiterated that each school division decides how their students will be chosen (ex. at least one slot per</li> </ul>

	middle school in Henrico and Richmond).  Other ideas for the committee to consider: admissions testing prep class for prospective students.  Global and Outreach  Kristi and Maureen met with Dr. Ellis in order to strengthen ties with VCU and their international department (Some new possibilities include the potential to offer Virginia Capitol Internship as a senior seminar for Fall 2018, explore VCU's willingness to allow an Intro to Homeland Security, Intro to Public Affairs, Intro to Public Policy. Dr. Ellis will explore.  Dean of International Studies at the University of Richmond is meeting with Dr. Ellis next week to determine new opportunities.  Other ideas include the following: Develop a relationship with Richmond Forum, Richmond Foreign Affairs Council; bring in a speaker series to include community invitation; Maureen Moslow-Benway's brother-in-law is a VP in a civil engineering company, and he thinks MLWGS should be involved with the planning of the new baseball stadium because other sports/athletic facilities are being built, and MLWGS may be able to take advantage (Paige Hawkins will be brought into the discussion).
